Supplies: as described in instructions for pine cone biscornu, your own project or 2 equal squares of fabrics, sewing pins, stitching needle, thread and scissors.

October 19 1:30 to 4pm. French beaded flowers rescheduled from the spring. Led by Sharon Rosen.




Using florist wire and beads, we will learn how to make three dimensional flowers.

Supplies. Some supplies maybe available from chapter donations. You will need wire cutters and a beading mat.

November 16 MARY CORBETT'S Flour Sack Towels. Surface stitching



This project is partially funded by the Sunday group's 2025 education grant. The final cost will be determined based on the number of participants.

We will be stitching the designs available on Mary Corbett's flour sack towels. The towels can be viewed at: www.shop.needlenthread.com. The picture with this article is only one of many options available. The design is preprinted onto the towels. Each order includes 3 towels of the same design.

Registration: please submit your registration including your design selection by September 15 to Sharon Rosen.

Supplies: You will provide your own threads, needles, scissors and hoop if desired.

As soon as your registrations are in, we will calculate the amount of your payment. Payment will be due by October 8 so that we can order your towels. Approximate cost including shipping \$20 to \$25.

December 14, 1:30 to 4:00 pm. Holiday party and continue stitching towels. In-person only.

Announcing our 2026 Chapter Wide Project!! Mad for Plaid Project Bags

All members are invited to join in on our 2026 Chapter Wide Project - the Mad for Plaid Project Bag. We will work on this project at our January and February 2026 meetings. The dates will be listed in the Day, Night and Sunday schedules. The Mad for Plaid Project Bag is great for storing works in progress and supplies. You can stitch on the bag itself to add your own personal touch. The size of the bag when flat is 11" x 16". We will be purchasing the Mad for Plaid from Its Sew Emma and the patterns are from Shephards Bush.

Four options are available that coincide with the seasons and one additional option just for fun:

SUMMER

Cross stitch pattern from Shepherd's Bush featuring a bag with the word Summer on it! Pattern is stitched on Mad for Plaid Bag Cornsilk using Weeks Dye Works and DMC Pearl threads. Bag stitch count is 35 x 52.

AUTUMN

Cross stitch pattern from Shepherd's Bush featuring the word Autumn on a plaid bag. Pattern is stitched on the Mad for Plaid Bag in Pumpkin using Weeks Dye Works and DMC Pearl Cotton Size 5 threads. Stitch count for the bag is 34 x 65.

WINTER

Cross stitch pattern from Shephard's Bush featuring the word "Winter" stitched on a bag with a snowman! Pattern is stitched on Mad for Plaid bag (Bluebell) using Weeks Dye Works and DMC Pearl cotton floss. DMC pearl substitutes for the Weeks Dye Works are 3756 or 3865 for Icicle, and 931 for Sky. Stitch count for the bag is 35 x 62.

SPRING

Cross stitch pattern from Shepherd's Bush featuring a fun floral themed spring bag! Pattern is stitched on Mad For Plaid Peony bag using Weeks Dye Works threads with DMC #5 Pearl threads. Stitch count is 33 x 64 for the bag.

SHEEP

Cross stitch pattern from Shepherd's Bush featuring the word "Sheep" stitched on a bag. Pattern is stitched on Mad For Plaid Bag "Lilac" and 32 ct Orchid Belfast using Weeks Dye Works and DMC pearl cotton #5. Stitch count is 38 x 62 for bag. My Sheep Bag Button Pack by Just Another Button Company.

Optional beads and buttons may be purchased on your own. Also participants will provide their own threads.

Project Participation Details

The cost of the project bag and pattern is \$25 and will be partially subsidized by the Chapter. The exact amount of the subsidy—and therefore each participant's final cost—will depend on the number of members who sign up.

Please complete the program coupon included in the newsletter and submit it to Kathy Sullivan by **September 1, 2025** or sign up on the registration sheets available at meetings. Note that payment is **not** required at the time of sign-up. Final payment will be collected in September, once the subsidy amount has been determined.

Please pick up any needles that may have dropped onto the floor. The church uses the same room for children's activities and needles on the floor can be dangerous to the children.


