

We welcome those of all skill levels and interest in any needle art technique.


America's Tapestry: An Update on the New York Panel

The New York panel of America's Tapestry is coming along nicely. Not only are we making headway on the stitching, but the appliques are ready to be added (when the time comes) and the background has been painted. Of course, there's still plenty of stitching left, so contact Jenni Paperman to get on the schedule. The Project Director, Stefan Romero, will be at the Van Schaick Mansion in Cohoes on Monday, October 20th from 7:00-9:00 PM, for a lecture about America's Tapestry and about the New York Panel. Jenni, who is the State Director for New York, will also be there. Show up to learn about the project and see the panel in person.

The DAR Chapter that runs the Van Schaick is very accommodating, and we can generally go over whenever we like to stitch. So get some friends together and stitch together.

Programs

Registration is now open for Terri Bay's Beginner Whitework class, *Sage*. *Sage* is a basic OR basic/Intermediate level Ukrainian Whitework design measuring four inches square. Students have a choice of White or Green/Blue color schemes (see images below). Students will also receive a choice of stitches for the diamond areas of the design. The Scotch Stitches in the green/blue version are very simple. The buttonhole motif in the white version is a little more difficult. Both stitches are demonstrated in class and the student can pick either version regardless of color choice. Other stitches in *Sage* are cable, satin, and eyelets. *Sage* is worked on 28 count linen with two sizes of pearl cotton.

The cost for the class is \$55. This covers the kit fee. The Chapter will be subsidizing the teaching fee.

Registration Deadline is December 1, 2025. There will be two Zoom lessons - Saturday, January 24, 2026 from 10am-12:30pm and Saturday, January 31, 2026 from 10am-12pm
