October 19 1:30 to 4pm FRENCH WIRE BEADED DAISIES

designed by Lauren Harpster In-person and via Zoom at 1:30 pm



Unlike most beading projects, French wire beading does not include using needles with impossibly small eyes that bend and break easily. The wire itself is the needle.

This project uses size 11 beads. The easiest to thread are those on hanks unless you have a bead sprinner. The wire is size 24 beading wire (on a spool).

As a group we will be following directions on Lauren's website and Facebook page. This is a program you can join with us or do on your own. You may use any color beads besides traditional daisies. You may want to consider black-eyed Susan, Gerber daisies or coneflower colors.

A symphony is an elaborate composition with grand proportions and varied elements. This Symphony is a counted canvas design, divided into several areas, some highly textured and complex, some smoother and soothing, all interesting. A choice of two colorways with a variety of threads, a challenge to the experienced stitcher but not beyond the reach of a less seasoned needleworker.

An online class with Debbie comes with lots of extras – larger than full sized color photographs of the project, an extra main graph, video stitch demonstrations, and recorded class sessions for those unable to attend "in person". The instruction book is extensive, more than 200 pages of very detailed step by step instructions and diagrams. Plus, we always have fun!

Design size 10" x 10" on 18 ct. white or Sandstone deluxe mono canvas, 180 x 180 stitches. Stitches include double fan doubled, walneto, Jessica, Amadeus, crescents, and more!

Students may supply their own threads: Threads used include: Caron Watercolours, DMC 8, Cotton Floss, Satin Floss, Kreinik #8 Braid, Rainbow Gallery Entice, Neon Rays and Silk Lame Braid. Supply list will be furnished following payment.

Level – advanced intermediate to advanced

Full Kit: \$200 plus \$20 shipping – Instruction booklet only: \$50 plus \$20 shipping

Teaching: \$20 per student regardless with kit or booklet.



Announcing SOTM 2026Margaret Bendig "Silken Sampler"



This sampler was designed to help the student practice laying silk for the best finish possible. The different patterns and stitches allow the effects of light on the silk to be seen. Using a monochromatic theme, it is easy to see the effect of the direction of the thread and the length of the stitch. While worked in the same color, some of the 21 sections look quite different because of the effect of light.

Solid color silk and an over-dyed silk for the dividing bands was used for this piece. You may use almost any thread including DMC floss. Needlepoint Inc would use 50 meters or 5 cards of Splendor silk (Rainbow Gallery). If you email Ellen, she will send you the list of threads.

While this piece was designed to fit into a Sudbury Petite Serving Tray (#65651), it may be framed or made into a pillow as well.
